

GUARANTOR :

- Guarantor who is an Australian Passport holder shall complete Section 12 and item A.
- Guarantor who is not an Australian Passport holder must be a currently practising professional, which must fall into one of the categories listed below:

Qualified Guarantor Groups for Mainland Chinese Equivalent Qualification

Categories – Mainland China	Must meet the following criteria
Accountant	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• CPA Qualification• Member of Accounting Society• Currently practising• <i>Note: Cashier/bookkeeper/payroll clerk etc not acceptable</i>
Dentist	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Licensed• Currently practising
Judge	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Official Judge of a People's Court• Currently practising
Medical Practitioner (Doctor)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Health Department Licence• Currently practising
Police Officer	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Public Security Bureau (PSB) officer• At least 5 years continuous service
Solicitor or Barrister (Lawyer)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Lawyer's Qualification• Valid Justice Department Work Licence• Currently practising
Teacher	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• At least 5 years continuous service• Employed by college or international college• In a teaching position – Not administration

Documents Required for Child's Passport Application:

- **Full Birth Certificate**
 - ❖ If the child was born in Australia, you will need to provide a full birth certificate (Birth extracts, commemorative certificates, photocopies or certified copies are NOT acceptable)
 - ❖ If the child was born overseas, you will need to provide the child's full overseas birth certificate with an English translation preferably issued by the local Notary Public Office)
- **Child's Australian Citizenship Certificate (if child was born overseas)**
- **One parent's original Australian passport (with a validity of more than two years and was issued before the child was born)**
- **Two Identical colour Photos (one endorsed by a qualified guarantor)**
- **A previous Australian Passport (if the child has one)**
- **Evidence of name change if**
 - ❖ The parent has changed names since any of the above documents was issued, original evidence of the change must be provided.
 - ❖ The parent wishes to record a name other than the child's birth, citizenship or previous passport name in the child's new passport; a change name certificate from the State Registrar of Births, Deaths and Marriages must be provided.
